SUBJECT: CERTIFICATION OF CONTINUING EMERGENCY AND RATIFICATION OF SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS ENACTED BY THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council certify the continuing emergency and ratify such rules and regulations enacted by the Director of Emergency Services in response to COVID-19.

BACKGROUND | ANALYSIS

The City Council last met on May 20 and certified the continuing emergency and ratified such rules and regulations enacted by the Director of Emergency Services in response to COVID-19. As was reported at the June 3 Study Session, the Restart Subcommittee met to discuss appropriate protocols and phasing for re-opening of activities at Holbrook Palmer Park consistent with the County's re-opening phases.

Following discussion, it was recommended that the Town allow the re-opening of dog training services at the Park. Such activity would be re-opened with the following protocols:

- Activity may be conducted outdoors only.
- Maximum of 10 people at a time, inclusive of any vendor/trainers.
- Social Distancing Protocols are required; masks required when closer than 6' to other people.
- If restrooms are accessed, vendor required to wipe down restroom after each use.
- If restrooms are accessed, no more than 1 person in the restroom at a time.
- Vendors/trainers/employees required to be COVID-19 screened before coming to work (no flu-like symptoms in the last 24 hours, no current fever, etc.)

The above rules and regulations were reviewed by the City Council Restart Ad Hoc Subcommittee and the Subcommittee is prepared to comment if desired. The rules were also provided to both Top Dog and Dog Days training program vendors.
